English

Curriculum:

Maths

In English we strive to build resilience and determination whilst developing students' abilities in reading, writing and speaking and listening.

Throughout the 5 years of their English experience, students will be exposed to a wide range of literary and non-fiction texts, not only to enrich students' understanding and appreciation of our literary heritage, but to also encourage a passion for reading. As well as this, we will endeavour to nurture and expand students' skills in analysing, evaluating and exploring texts.

English as an Additional Language

We are proud to say we now have over seventy students whose first language is not English, bringing twenty four different nationalities and cultures to the school.

Our EAL co-ordinator's aim is to support the students both pastorally and academically. In a dedicated EAL classroom, students who need more intensive support will have 1:1 sessions or small group sessions where they will continue to access the curriculum but in more depth and with more guidance. They mix as a cohort, in a safe environment where they know they can make progress. We also provide in lesson support for those who need it.

Our ultimate aim is to develop their English skills so that they can successfully sit their GCSE exams and prepare them for their next step in education. We are also able to offer GCSE exams in their native language and have many who have taken Polish, Greek and Italian to name a few.

In Maths, we give pupils the opportunity to challenge themselves and develop previous knowledge in all aspects of maths: number, algebra, measure, and data. Through the 5 years of maths, pupils will develop skills which enable them to build on these foundations to progress through their GCSE journey to not only achieve their maths qualification but also a passion for maths.

Students will be expected to complete calculations and use the skills learnt to complete problem solving questions, they will also have the opportunity to practice basic maths skills and develop new skills.



Science

Curriculum:

Performing Arts

The science department, through the good teaching of an ambitious curriculum, excellent planning, differentiation and feedback, intend that students at Rushden Academy will:

- 1. Get hands on practical experience that will develop key skills such as teamwork, problem solving and an awareness of risk and prevention.
- 2. Through being set practical challenges and allowing students to learn through doing, they will develop a sense of curiosity, and the bravery to ask why and not accept what is presented on TV and social media at face value.
- 3. Students will be expected to use data, practical skills and computer skills to research, evaluate and respond to the technological and ecological problems facing future generations.
- 4. Students will be given opportunities to link their knowledge to the various disciplines in science and other subjects in cross curricular learning.
- 5. Opportunities to see how science is used in the "real world" will be offered through STEM links, trips and visits, as well as in lesson content and contexts to raise aspirations.

At Rushden Academy we pride ourselves on delivering high quality Performing Arts provision both in and out of the classroom. We believe Performing Arts plays a significant and exciting role in the educational experience of our students, and as such we strive to offer a provision and opportunities that stimulate and inspire our young people.

Rushden Academy has an exciting Performing Arts program with Dance, Drama & Music embedded within the Key Stage 3 curriculum. All three subjects are then offered at Key stage 4 & 5 alongside other overarching subjects such as a specific Performing Arts qualification.

As a department we aspire to provide students with an opportunity to develop their skills and passion and foster a culture for appreciation of the Arts through a range of experiences and opportunities. From a curriculum designed to engage and excite, offering workshops delivered by industry professionals, regular trips to West End productions, opportunities to perform in venues around the county and producing work for the local community, to an extensive programme of Extracurricular events, Rushden Academy Performing Arts aims to create a culture of learning through the arts that encourages inclusion, promotes creativity, supports progression and develops crucial life skills

Creative Arts

Curriculum:

PE

Our team of four dedicated Art, design and photography teachers and a technician deliver a curriculum which covers the whole range of artistic activity from painting and drawing to printmaking and digital photography.

We have a purpose-built photography studio and 2 sixth form studios for art and photography alongside a dedicated computer room and professional quality vinyl printing facilities.

We want to inspire and build creativity within our students to give them the skills and knowledge to develop a passion and understanding of art, craft and



design. To foster independence and confidence in the subject to allow students to enjoy expressing their ideas by exploring all media within all art and design.

Within the Creative Arts Faculty we aim to foster pupil's creativity through a structured programme of activities through the genres of graphic design, art and photography. Pupils are taught to observe, represent and record the world around them in detail

Work is developed from observation, experience and imagination.

We encourage pupils to think about and record both visual and tactile elements such as colour, pattern, texture, line, tone, shape, form and space.

We teach pupils to explore the qualities of different materials and processes whilst also allowing them to experiment with combinations for effect. This includes projects in both two and three dimensional forms of varying different scales.

At Rushden Academy, we recognise the importance of PE and the role it has to play in promoting long term, healthy lifestyles and making a positive impact on physical, mental and social health. The intent of our PE curriculum is to provide all students with high quality PE and sport provision.

Our curriculum focuses on six key strands of Physical Education and form the basis of our teaching in both Key Stage 3 and 4:

Physical ME Social ME Leadership ME Healthy ME Theory ME Coaching ME

Each strand represents a different area of the Physical Education as we understand and appreciate the differing skills and qualities required in the world of health and physical activity.

It is our vision for every student to succeed and achieve their potential as well as to lead physically active lifestyles beyond their years at secondary school. We strive to inspire our students through fun and engaging PE lessons that are enjoyable, challenging and accessible to all. We want our students of Rushden Academy to appreciate the benefits of a healthy active lifestyle. Through our teaching of PE we will instil our TEAM RUSHDEN values and transferable life skills, such as resilience and mutual respect, as well as providing them with opportunities to take part in competitive sport through our extensive extra-curricular programme.

Our extra-curricular programme is open to all our students to attend on a competitive and social basis, which is run throughout the academic year and for those wishing to play competitively have further opportunities to represent the school locally, regionally and nationally in various sporting activities.

Child Development

Curriculum:

Humanities

BTEC TECH AWARD - Child Development

The Award gives learners the opportunity to develop applied knowledge and understanding of child development and growth up to the age of five, how children learn through play and how meeting the needs of individual children will support their development, play and learning.

The Tech award is split into 3 different components:

Component 1 - Children's Growth and Development

Component 2 - Learning Through Play

Component 3 - Supporting Children to Play Learn and Develop

In a practical learning environment, learners will have the opportunity to develop knowledge and technical skills in the following areas:

 The characteristics of children's development from birth up to five years

- Factors that affect growth and development
- · The importance of play
- How play promotes children's learning and development
- Reasons why children may need support
- Child-friendly environments to support play, learning and development in children
- Supporting all children to learn and develop physically, intellectually, emotionally and socially, and adapting activities to support children's play, learning and development.

Component One and Two are both assessed Internally through the completion of set tasks which is then externally moderated. Component Three is assessed through a written examination that is externally marked by the exam board (Pearson).

RE

Rushden Academy's Religious Education curriculum is academically challenging and personally inspiring; it is designed to equip pupils with the knowledge, skills and awareness for life in twenty first century Britain and to develop their religious literacy.

An understanding of religion in the local context will develop pupils' sense of belonging and community, whilst also nurturing a respect for diversity which will prepare them for our modern, multicultural society.

Geography

Geography enables students to understand the local, national and global context surrounding their day-to-day lives and to gain an appreciation for both the science behind our ever-changing planet, as well as the decisions that we as humans make.

We aim to develop geographers that are both well informed and responsible world citizens.

Students will work hard to think critically about the world around them and to fully comprehend their roles in the future of our planet.

History

The study of history enables students to gain historical perspective by placing their growing knowledge into different contexts, understanding the connections between local, regional, national and international history; between cultural, economic, military, political, religious and social history and between short- and long-term timescales.

We aim to develop historians that are both well informed and responsible world citizens, challenging their problem-solving skills to achieve success.

Modern Foreign Languages

In MFL, our ambition is to provide students with a broad languages curriculum. All learning is focused on the ability to understand and communicate and we aim to provide the skills to enable students to do that.

We also encourage all our language learners to explore the culture of **French** and **German** speaking people and to develop an understanding of what life is like in those countries.

Ultimately, we hope to build the foundations for further study and develop competent communicators and international thinkers for a Global World.

Students will be prepared for an enterprising future by studying and practising the knowledge, behaviours and skills related to researching, planning for, pitching and reviewing an enterprise. Students will be able to develop their technical skills - such as market research, planning, promotion and finance – using realistic work scenarios, and personal skills - such as monitoring own performance, time management and problem solving - through a practical and skills-based approach to learning and assessment.

Drama thrives in our strong performing arts department. Students have opportunities to take part in workshops and whole-school productions.

The academy has taken part in The National Theatre Connections 500 project and regularly has students selected for the National Youth Theatre.

Music is a popular after-school activity with an orchestra and jazz band, this year we are determined to set up a school choir too.
Peripatetic music teachers visit to give private

instrumental lessons too. Our art department fosters talent both in and out of lesson time, our most recent addition is photography and that is already proving to be a big success.

Over the last 3 years we have hosted a large careers and enterprise event in order to inform our youngsters about potential careers and learn more about the world of work.



Pupils are also encouraged to participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme.



Personal Development

Personal Development aims to prepare you for the wider world outside school. This includes life skills such as Swimming and First Aid as well as careers focused skills such as Teamwork, Leadership, Budgeting and Target Setting. Personal Development can also include learning about Health, Wellbeing and Relationships as well as community values and citizenship.

Mental Health & Wellbeing

Mental health and wellbeing is really important to us. We aim to support all students both academically and with their emotional health, through any challenges.

We have great facilities including our "Hub provision". We strive for a calm environment which holistically helps the students. The team works closely with the students, guiding them to improve their problem solving skills, providing them with coping strategies and equipping them with skills to use in times of challenge and difficulties.

If students require additional support via external agencies, our team is trained to seek the appropriate service. We are able to guide students through this process.

Anti-bullying Charter

Here at Rushden Academy we work in partnership with pupils and parents in all matters related to bullying concerns. Our work ranges from educating our pupils to training our staff in recognising, responding and reporting bullving.

This work together with the stepped approach we take when bullying occurs has been credited by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. All our pupils sign up to our Anti-Bullying Charter and our pupils are confident that whenever bullying is reported to us, we will respond quickly and do all we can to put a stop to it.

Ethos Team

Our vision is to support the emotional, relational and spiritual needs of students and their families We do this through a tailored programme which covers everything from individual mentoring to focused group intervention, parent skills classes to family coffee mornings, themed workshops to skills lessons, and a whole range of other activities in between. This programme is underpinned by our aims to enable young people to develop character & values, build healthy relationships and understand Christian perspectives. We love to support the families and students of Rushden Academy, and believe that everyone has unique potential. We look forward to meeting you!

Cultural Capital

Here at Rushden Academy we want all our pupils to acquire the essential knowledge that children need to be educated citizens. This acquisition of knowledge can take many forms from listening and appreciating classical music, playing ukuleles, trips to the theatre and performing in our spectacular shows to travelling half-way around the world to Uganda. Our pupils are given opportunities to be subject ambassadors and pupil leaders and play an active role in shaping the Academy. The personal development of our pupils is crucial and our Learning For Life Experiences provide enhanced opportunities for them to gain a wider and deeper understanding of the world and society around them.

We reward students in a number of ways. Firstly, on a day to day basis students can be rewarded in lessons by the rewarding of an achievement point. These are then totalled up at the end of every half term and students are rewarded in our year group Rewards Assemblies with certificates and vouchers! Students with good behaviour and attendance across the year also then get invited to join us on our annual rewards trips at the end of the year. Students are involved in deciding where we visit and in previous years we have visited theme parks, zoos, aquariums, outdoor adventure venues and paint-balling trips! We also host an annual Rewards Evening where students and their families are invited to celebrate their successes together.

SMSC

SMSC stands for Spiritual, Moral, Cultural and Social development. We build on students' academic learning by covering these areas in normal lessons as well as during bespoke Personal Development and PSHE lessons. We also explore these aspects of our learning during a number of extra-curricular events and activities in school such as Learning For Life Experiences, Remembrance Day Service, Duke of Edinburgh use of our Student Leadership Team and other various trips.



The Academy has committed to a devoted reading time during the school day. Staff and students, come together in their reading groups to enjoy and share the reading of their class book. This is based on successful educational research into challenging students to read and finish two novels in 12 weeks. The intent for this is to progress independent reading

by encouraging pace and fluency to improve understanding, and vocabulary.

This is a positive and engaging intervention that everyone takes part in. Students are encouraged to read as they realise the focus is to connect with the story and that they have the opportunity to finish a book. The books chosen are diverse, add cultural capital and breadth within a wider curriculum.

Canteen

We have a fantastic catering team at Rushden Academy, who pride themselves on providing nutritious food throughout the day for our students. We operate a cashless catering system, which involves parents making online payments and students using their thumbprint to pay for transactions

Meal Options:

Breakfast – we offer a selection of pastries, toast, cereal, fruit, fruit juice and hot chocolate.

Morning Break – There are a selection of snacks available daily. There are chicken wings, pizza slices, bagels, bacon rolls, beans on toast, potato waffles and much more.

Our selection varies throughout the

Main Meals - There is a daily fixed price menu with a vegetarian option. The three weekly cycle is displayed in the canteen and on the academy website. The daily meal is available as a meal deal with a dessert or a drink, or may be purchased just as a

meal. We also provide a selection of sandwiches, baguettes, salad pots, hand held snack items along with hot pasta and sauce as well as jacket potatoes.

Homemade cakes & desserts -

A different selection available daily. These range from a traditional hot dessert with custard to fruit pots

Drinks – We provide a healthy selection of drinks, we also have a slush drinks machine with four flavours. All drinks are school compliant and the fruit infused hydration station is available daily as a complimentary service.

When a student joins Rushden Academy we make a seven year commitment that he/she is provided with a superb education equipping them to continue studying at university or have a good career apprenticeship.

Here at Rushden Academy we are very proud of our Sixth Form. We aim high for all our students to ensure our preparation for their futures is first class and our students achieve excellent results year after year. As part of the long standing collaboration as part of East Northamptonshire College we are developing models

of excellence for all our young people. We offer a wide range of courses and subjects to cater for all student's needs and chosen pathways from Hair and Beauty to Further Maths. We publish a separate Sixth Form prospectus in which students may view the options available to them as they plan their next steps in Year 11 (available via our website).

They are guided by our Sixth Form team and every student is offered the opportunity to meet with the Head of Sixth to help them make the right personal choices.

Each year an ever-growing number of students go on to higher education when they leave Rushden Academy, with more applying for university and an increase in applications to Russell Group universities. In the past few years students have gone to the Universities of Birmingham, Cambridge, Cardiff, Durham, Manchester and Nottingham.

Students are encouraged to start thinking early in their school careers about their future direction.

They have timetabled periods on development and career-related matters, work experience opportunities, the UCAS process, university visits and practice interviews and talks by many different industry specialists.

Year 12 students are expected to complete the Extended Project Qualification, a mini dissertation researched and written on a subject of their own choice, or through the General Studies syllabus expand and develop their thinking skills as part of their preparation for further education.

All students also complete an additional enrichment programme which involves voluntary work in the community, supporting younger students in the academy as well as building essential knowledge and skill sets to make them readily employable. We also offer a wide range of careers guidance and enrichment activities including motivational speakers from universities, business and industry, as well as numerous field trips, theatre visits and even the opportunity to attend a youth conference in Uganda.

Admissions

Moving from primary to secondary school is an exciting and significant event. Rushden Academy recognises this as an important milestone and aims to make the transition as smooth and problem free as possible with a mix of open days and evenings, tours, visits to primary schools, induction days and information evenings.

For parents and children in Years 5 and 6 key dates are in September/ October when we hold our open evening for prospective parents and Year 5 and 6 students.

Deadline for applications

The end of October is the deadline for applications for places at Rushden Academy for Year 7 the following September.

Applications are possible after this date but they will be treated as late admissions under the Local Authority's agreed procedures.

Pupils are admitted without reference to ability, aptitude or culture.

Applications within the normal admissions round for entry into Year 7 are made through the co-ordinated admissions system of the Local Authority in which a family lives.
