

Non-Prescription Medication

Following a review of the Health and Safety Policy at Rushden Academy, non-prescription medication will no longer be administered by the school. This includes paracetamol and homoeopathic medicines.

Staff may not know whether the student has taken a previous dose, or whether the medication may react with other medication being taken. Where it is appropriate (on rare occasions) to administer non-prescription medicine to a student, specific permission will need to be given by parents/carers on each occasion.

Cross Country County Competition

On Saturday morning we had two Rushden Academy students competing in the County Cross Country trials at Abington Park, Northampton. Winnie L and Preston W qualified to represent East Northants due to their impressive performance in the district competition before Christmas. Cheered on by both Mr Harris and Ms Mcveigh, Winnie started us off with a courageous performance in incredibly difficult conditions, the big hills proving really difficult for all athletes. Preston had County qualification in his sights prior to the race and was very focused on achieving that throughout the race. He put in an absolutely stunning performance racing into 14th position at the end of the first circuit, knowing he had to come within the top 18 to qualify to represent Northamptonshire in the next round. Despite dropping

a couple of places, Preston fought hard to hold his ground and came a fantastic 17th place!!! A very proud moment for both him and his supporting dad!

A massive well done to both students who once demonstrated incredible willingness to compete in tough conditions, as well as a huge thank you to both sets of parents who attended and supported their children. 

For many of the students this was the very first time they have represented their school and Rushden Academy and we as a PE team and school could not be any prouder of their achievement!!




Bookbuzz Book Review

Medicine on the Western Front Workshop

On Wednesday 26th January, Year 11 were lucky enough to partake in a history workshop put on by David and Richard from Frontline Living History who brought with them their extensive First World War battlefield artefacts and replicas.

They shared their knowledge with our Year 11 historians who will be using it in their upcoming mock and in their final GCSE History Paper 1: Medicine Through Time.

Richard and David really brought to life the experiences of soldiers in the trenches on the Western Front by passing around helmets, weapons and even recreating the smell of mustard gas.

Private Orton made an excellent First World War soldier and, when he was injured on the battlefield, it was a good job the pals in his battalion: Lewis, Harrison, Jayden and Jakub were there to get him down the chain of evacuation.

Performing Arts at Update



Drama

Year 11 BTEC Performing Arts students are working extremely hard this term with the initial stages of their Component 3 part of the BTEC qualification. Students have been given their stimulus 'Better Together' are now in the ideas stage of the process. Students have created mood boards to show their interpretation and are now using practical exploration methods of the very talented theatre company 'The Paper Birds'.

Dance

Our amazing Year 10 BTEC Dance students are coming to the end of their contemporary dance exploration as part of their component 1 coursework. Students have shown huge interest towards researching the roots and foundations, who are the practitioners that contributed to the evolution of contemporary dance and created movement phrases in reflection of their findings. Currently students are building a performance piece which demonstrates their understanding of the stylistic features of contemporary dance and touches upon the theme of mental health.

Music

Year 9 are continuing their Music for media project to learn about the use of music in response to a visual stimuli. Previously they added sound effects to a Tom and Jerry cartoon and this week they have used Windows Video Editor to attach 14 specific sound effects to a silent movie at specific timelines within the 1 minute 20 sec clip. Additionally they will source and upload musical loops from Bandlab to add background music to add tension into the film. This revisit to Bandlab software will brush up techniques used in an earlier project and involve the skill of dovetailing the sounds and experiment to maximise the impact of music to the viewer.





On Saturday 26th February 2022 MED-SOC will be coming to Rushden Academy providing the opportunity for students to experience clinical careers first hand.

The event is delivered by the award-winning human anatomist Samuel Piri who has been featured on the BBC, The Discovery Channel & Medicplayer.

At the event, Sam and his team will provide the opportunity for students to participate in the dissection of real organ specimens including a head & brain, lungs & heart as well as a digestive tract showcasing the stomach, liver, gall bladder, pancreas and intestines. The day is rigorously academic with students receiving award-winning insight into how the body works and the challenges faced by the next generation of medical professionals.

All of the content is carefully matched to the main GCSE, A-Level & BTEC specifications and is relevant to the study students are undertaking in the classroom. The event operates in such a way that it appeals to the students considering both medicine, dentistry & veterinary science as well as those considering; nursing, midwifery, paramedic science, occupational therapy, pharmacology, biomedical science and sports sciences.

How to Access Go4Schools

Check if You or Your Child has Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- a high temperature this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3
 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be
 worse than usual)
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

- 1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
- 2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- you're worried about your symptoms
- you're not sure what to do
