

KS3 Musical Update


Our KS3 Musical 'Matilda' is FINALLY here!

New Multi-Faith Prayer Space


We are delighted to be able to open our new Multi Faith Prayer Space in school this week.

Top Tips for Parents Who Are Separated

The FJYPB members are children and young people with experience of family law proceedings. They have devised these top tips for parents to help them think about matters from their child's perspective.



'Listen to your child'

- 1. Remember I have the right to see both of my parents as long as it is safe for me.
- 2. I can have a relationship with the partner of my other parent without this changing my love for you.
- 3. Try to have good communication with my other parent because it will help me. Speak to them nicely.
- 4. Keep my other parent updated about my needs and what is happening for me. I might need their help to.
- 5. Don't say bad things about my other parent, especially if I can hear. Remember I can often overhear your conversations or see your social media comments.
- 6. Don't make me feel guilty about spending time with my other parent.
- 7. Don't make permanent decisions about my life based on how you feel at the moment. Think about how I feel now and how I might feel in the future. My wishes might change.
- 8. Be open to change, be flexible and compromise when agreeing arrangements for me.
- 9. Its ok with me if my parents don't do things exactly the same. You are both different and that's alright with me.
- 10. Don't be possessive over me and the things that belong to me. Make it easy for me to take the things I need when I spend time with my other parent, such as school work, PE kits, clothes, books, games, phone etc. Let me choose what I want to take with me.
- 11. Keep me informed about any changes to my arrangements.
- 12. Try not to feel hurt if I choose to spend time with my friends instead of seeing you. I am growing up!
- 13. Remember that important dates (birthdays, celebrations, parents evening, sports day etc are special to you, me and my other parent. I may want to share my time on those dates with each of you.
- 14. Work out between you and my other parent who is responsible for the extra things I need, such as new school shoes and uniform, school trips, dinner money and the cost of my hobbies or after school activities. I don't want to be involved in this.

Top Tips for Parents Who Are Separated Continued...

- 16. Make sure I am not left out of key family events. Please compromise with my other parent so I can join in.
- 17. Please don't stop me having contact with extended family members who are important to me. Ask me how I feel about them. Don't assume my feelings are the same as yours.
- 18. Don't use me as a messenger between you and my other parent.
- 19. Don't use my relationship with my other parent against me, or them.
- 20. Don't ask me to lie to my other parent or other family members.
- 21. Don't ask me to lie to professionals, or to say what you want me to say.
- 22. Remember that I might want something different to my brother or sister.
- 23. Don't worry about how others see you or what they think. I am what matters.

6th Form IGUS Apprenticeship Visit

Year 13 potential apprenticeship students visited IGUS, an engineering company in Northampton. They were shown around by MD Matthew Aldridge who explained how the company runs a vibrant apprenticeship programme ranging from engineering to finance, from sales to production.

Our students also got the chance to converse with 4 current apprentices, working across various departments at IGUS to find out about their experiences and what it is like to train there.

All of the students were actively engaged during the visit and as always were ambassadors for the academy.



Proven Responses to the Most Frustrating Back Talk

When kids act out, they have an arsenal of backtalk they fire at you in order to put you on the defensive - a secret language that's designed to win them control and absolve them of responsibility. If you take those comments at face value - or take them to heart - you'll always be on the defensive, constantly reacting to a child who's out of control.

In this article, we examine the most common backtalk that kids hurl at their parents when they act out, what they really mean, and how to respond to them in an effective way that puts the responsibility to behave appropriately where it should be: on the child.

"I'll Do It Later"

When kids act out, they aren't always confrontational. One way children get around the rules of the household is to procrastinate and put their parents off until they eventually stop asking kids to help out.

While many parents rationalize, "It's easier if I just do it myself," you need to understand that giving in to your child gives them a false sense of entitlement, a sense that "the world owes them something" and that they do not need to meet their responsibilities.

Examples:

Child: "I'll do it later"

Translation: If I put it off long enough, you'll give up and I won't have to do it. You'll probably even do it for me.

Ineffective: "Okay, but make sure you get it done."

Effective: "Well, that's fine. But you won't get your allowance until it's done." Or, "Well, that's fine, but you can't use the phone until it's done."

"You Don't Love Me"

Children often use guilt to manipulate us. This is just another version of "I hate you" and, again, they use this backtalk to get what they want. Don't give in. Here's how to deflect the guilt by using an effective response that puts the emphasis where it should be: on your child and the importance of following family rules.

Child: "Why can't I go out with my friends? You don't love me."

Translation: I'm going to put you on the defensive and hit you where it really hurts so you give in and let me go out.

Ineffective: "You know I love you! I took you to the mall yesterday!"

Effective: "The issue is not that I love you. The issue is that we have rules in our family about Sunday afternoons."



Aspire - Explore - Succeed : Celebrating Former Students

It is always nice to hear how former students are getting on once they leave us, it's even better when part of their job role brings them back to Rushden to inspire current students at careers events.

Harley Childs left Rushden Academy in 2015 and since then has gone from strength to strength as you can read here:

I left Rushden Academy in 2015 not clear on what career pathway I wanted to take, I came across an apprenticeship route with an independent provider for Business Administration, for me this was the first step into working whilst learning, I achieved a level 2 in Business Administration. In December 2016 I



decided to start my career within the NHS at Northamptonshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust as a Recruitment Services Apprentice and never looked back.

Whilst working within recruitment I started my level 3 Business Administration course and very quickly got promoted to be a Recruitment Specialist for Temporary staffing and then later on for the Mental Health division. After just over a year within recruitment I moved to take up the post of Personal Assistant to the Assistant Director of Mental Health North and Administration Manager for a team of 6 within Mental Health Adult Inpatient Services. During this role I completed my PRINCE2 Project Management qualification and also my Quality Service and Design qualification to learn how to best support Senior Management in improving their services. I left this role after 2 wonderful years to move onto my current role as Business Management & Project Support Lead for Mental Health, Learning Disability and Secure Services supporting various projects across the organisation and providing advice and support to colleagues within our directorate.

Most recently at the age of 22 I have accepted the post of Business Manager to Angela Hillery CEO of Northamptonshire Healthcare NHS Trust & Leicestershire Partnership NHS Trust and will be using my skills and knowledge to support Angela and her Executive Team across both of these organisations to ensure the smooth running of the administrative function in the CEO's office.

What I would say is that my career path hasn't always been easy; there are many challenges that you face along the way especially starting my career in the NHS at 17, managing a team at 19 with others around you thinking 'has he got the knowledge and skills to be in that position?' Remember it is all about your ability and others will recognise that potential in you that you don't always recognise yourself, with determination and support from those around you, you can achieve your goals. I wasn't the most academic at school but have found a path that has allowed me to have an amazing career already!

working under the direction of the producer and other production staff to undertake whatever basic tasks are required to ensure the smooth running of the production process.







Interview with Matilda's Stage Manager: Miss Taylor

What's been the most challenging prop to make?

It's got to be the chalkboard, because it has to work both as an actual chalkboard for the cast to write on and it has to work on its own so it has to write by its self. We have gone through 3 different ways of doing this until we found one that is going to work for the show. It also has to come off and on seamlessly because we've got to make sure crew can bring it on, so we have had to put it on wheels - there's definitely a lot around that prop.

What is your role and what do the crew do?

My role is the stage manager, I am in charge of organising the crew and running the technical rehearsal. I need to make sure all of the props are done in time and that the set comes on and on properly. The crew have spent a lot of time getting props together and making them.

Favourite musical number?

It has to be revolting children, not just because its an amazing song but also because I've seen it done throughout the years by different students, I've also performed it myself!
