Library Update


Don't forget to return all your books before the end of the year

Tuck Shop





Cost of Living Payment

Guidance on getting an extra payment to help with the cost of living if you're entitled to certain benefits or tax credits.

You may be able to get a payment to help with the cost of living if you're getting certain benefits or tax credits.

You do not need to apply. If you're eligible, you'll be paid automatically in the same way you usually get your benefit or tax credits. The payments will be made separately from your benefit or tax credits.

These payments are not taxable and will not affect the benefits or tax credits you get.

You may be eligible if you are:

- on Low income benefits
- on Tax Credits
- on Disability Benefits
- entitled to Winter Fuel Benefits

Performing Arts Update

Drama

This week year 9 students have been looking at devising and creating their final devised performances of year 9. Students have been looking at several different exploration strategies and have been thinking about how they can use this in performance. They are creating performances centred around a character and their experience of social media .

Dance

Year 7 dancers have been looking at choreography and using a stimulus to do this. They have been creating dances in the style of chance dance ' Chance Dance was created by Merce Cunningham (1919-2009). He was an American modern dancer/choreographer who introduced new forms for dance movement. Students have been creative and using their imaginations to create dances.

Music

Students are ramping up to their final assessments next week, Year 7 and 8s bands are fully in swing and are pulling their performance together. Over the remaining lessons students will be looking at how the Music Industry uses promotional tools and materials and will be applying this knowledge to create material for their own bands image.

Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit - income dependant
