Message From the Principal

Dear Parent / Carer

The Christmas holidays are fast approaching as we move into the final two weeks of the term. The arrangements for the final day will be shared with students next week but I wanted to make you aware that the last Friday of this term, which is the 16th December, students will be allowed to go home at the earlier time of 1pm. If there are any issues with your child leaving school at this time, please contact your child's Head of Year to discuss this.

Year 10 and 11 students started their week with some important careers assemblies which gave students a valuable insight into a variety of jobs. Learning about different careers and the associated skills and qualifications is an important part of our personal development programme at Rushden Academy. If your child would like any more information about the careers shared in the assembly, or in relation to any other career, they can see Mr Billam who will be able to advise them on where they can find more information.

Mrs Brainwood led the assemblies for our lower school students on the theme of kindness. She shared the recent, inspirational efforts of Kevin Sinfield, who ran an ultramarathon every day for seven consecutive days in order to raise money for Motor Neurone Disease charities after his close friend Rob Burrows was diagnosed with the disease. Students were encouraged to reflect on this act of kindness and think about the positive impact we can have on others by demonstrating kindness through words and actions.

Mr Noblett, our Ethos Team Leader, arranged for knife crime workshops to take place for our Year 8 students which they participated in well. The workshops delivered some powerful and important messages about knife crime and the risk associated with carrying knives; most notably that people that carry knives are most likely to be injured by the knife they are carrying rather than someone else's knife. Students left the session much more aware of knife crime and the associated risks and potential consequences.

A highlight of my week is recognising the successes of our students and this week I had the pleasure of signing certificates for Ben and Olivia, both of whom have become triple millionaires having read more than 3 million words since September; an incredible effort from both of them! In addition, I am also delighted to share that our Year 7 indoor athletics team bested 5 other schools and finished as overall winners at the district indoor athletics competition on Thursday afternoon.

Should parents or carers require their child to remain in school until 3.00pm please contact our main reception with your details so that arrangements can be made accordingly.




This Week in Science

Firstly the Science Department would like to say a big well done to our year 11 pupils who have worked really hard for their recent mocks. There have been some very encouraging results so with some good revision we hope they will succeed in the real exams in the summer!

In Physics year 11's have been re-visiting the tough longer questions using "Structure Strips". We usually call these "the 6 markers!". Pupils often have lots of sound scientific ideas for these long questions but under exam conditions sometimes find it difficult to arrange them in priority. We encourage them to write on 6 small strips of paper with only one key fact on each. They are then asked to place them in a logical order as you can see in the photographs.



Meanwhile in year 10 we have been looking at how chemicals move in and out of cells. Two of the key processes are DIFFUSION & OSMOSIS. These are a key part of biochemistry and are very important in some real world applications and breakthroughs.

Perfume, bubble baths and deodorants, found in many Christmas box sets, use diffusion to spread their scent. Dogs, cats, moths and foxes communicate by diffusing pheromones. Frankincense, one of the gifts from the 3 wise men found in so many carols, is spread in the same way.

Inside the body, cells and organs exchange chemicals through the cell membrane. So for example the kidney filters our blood using osmosis, and sports "isotonic" drinks are used to rehydrate cells after exercise. This process has allowed scientists to develop artificial kidneys for dialysis, cheap and portable water purification equipment for water aid and drought affected regions. It is also a potential line of research for biological batteries to help with electrical power and vehicles. Drugs are being designed to be delivered more precisely to target only the affected tissues without the usual side effects.

In the current push to place women and men on the moon in this decade, these scientific breakthroughs will be part of the solution. This is likely to create more STEM based jobs and training programmes in our area.

One of the things that post lockdown we have been trying to do is get more experiments back into the science curriculum. Last week year 10's in biology looked at diffusion in jelly babies and skittles. The photo shows the blue and red jelly babies in the petri dish, used to show diffusion. We tried to link this to England V USA last Friday. I will let you analyse the results of that experiment and decide what it predicted about the score!



This Week in Science




This week the same year 10s were able to see how plant tissues behaved in concentrated and weak (Hypertonic & Hypotonic) solutions. We see in the picture “Kevin” the carrot, “Pete the potato” and “Barbara” the beetroot. Pupils measured the effect of these solutions on the size and mass of the vegetable chips. Ones in Hypertonic (salt water) shrank, those in Hypotonic (distilled water) grew! If we are to put people on the moon they will have to grow food hydroponically using these principles.

Finally this week, Year 11s have been using analytical chemistry to solve crime using chromatography of ink analysis. This technique uses a solvent to dissolve a pigment solute making a solution or liquid phase. This then moves through paper or powder on a thin layer, known as the stationary phase. This causes the substances to separate, in this case into coloured bands (see photo). This technique is used in forensics to catch forgers and poisoners or polluters. In medicine it is used to screen babies at birth for phenylketonuria PKU - the heel prick test, and to check people for genetic disorders. DNA fingerprinting and of course the dreaded Covid rapid test!

On Thursday 8th December, students can wear a Christmas jumper over their shirt and tie. Full school uniform should still be worn.





Performing Arts Update

Drama

Year 8 and 9 have been looking into technical theatre this week. Both have been exploring how we incorporate tech into performance and have been making creative choices in how to do this. We have looked at costume and lighting this week using costume worksheets and online software. The students have been creative and impressed us with their design choices. Well done year 8 and 9!

Dance

Year 9 Dancers have been participating in dance auditions and the realistic process of a performer in the industry. During the last 5 weeks students explored many roles such as auditioning as a soloist, in a group, creating new choreography and acting in the role of a dance agent. Throughout the rest of the term students will explore the career choices and even create their own dancer portfolio.

Music

This week has been a rehearsal week for all years. Year 7s have been building on their Djembe piece, adding their own rhythms to the work created previously and putting in dynamic changes to show instrument control.
