Dear Parent / Carer

The first few weeks of school have flown and it has been a genuine pleasure to drop into lessons and see your children engaging with their learning so positively.

It was Mr Billam's turn to lead assemblies which focused on the Rushden STARR value of serving others. Students

reflected on U-Boat 559 and those that sacrificed their lives to protect a code book in contrast with things they can do on a daily basis to help such as washing up, making dinner or cutting the lawn. They then looked at the Bronze Serve criteria and were encouraged to think about what they can do to achieve each criterion.

Miss McKenzie, our Ethos Team's Family Support Worker, organised a coffee morning for Year 7 parents which was very well attended. It was lovely to see parents and carers talking about how their children have settled in at Rushden Academy and I very much appreciated the opportunity to talk with many of you about the transition to Secondary School. We will look to hold more of these events in future which provide a face to face opportunity to talk about the education we provide here at Rushden Academy.

The new food room has gone down exceptionally well with all students and I have been into Mr Brainwood's lessons regularly to see excited students learning knife skills, preparing vegetables for spiced carrot and red lentil soup and fruit salads. Cooking is an important life skill and I look forward to seeing this area of the curriculum go from strength to strength over the coming years.

On Thursday evening, we welcomed many of you that have children in Year 11 for the Class of 2024 launch. Those of you that attended should have gained a good oversight of the year ahead in terms of key exam dates, the content covered on different exams and plenty of ideas of how to support your child with their revision in this important year. We also provided a resource pack to all students to help kick start their revision. It was great to see a real 'buzz' around the progress league tables with lots of you keen to see where your child is currently in the standings. The presentation will be sent out to all parents and we will be following up with parents and carers who were not in attendance.

Last week I mentioned the importance of monitoring your child's social media and this week I wanted to make you all aware of the government's new online safety bill which is likely to come into effect imminently. The bill proposes to introduce a number of new offences in relation to mobile devices and there will be assemblies for students next week to go through these. Most importantly is the introduction of an offence whereby any student who films or distributes images or videos of fighting, which has been the case in the past, will result in potential criminal investigations.

Just a reminder that next Thursday, after school, is our Year 7 meet the tutor evening so that parents and carers can meet with your child's form tutor to discuss how they have settled in.

Finally, thank you for working with us to resolve any uniform issues from the start of term; it is greatly appreciated.


This Week in Food Technology

Year 7s have had their first attempts at knife skills. We have been using the 'bridge' and the 'claw' methods to prepare vegetables. With 180 students practicing their knife skills, I consider just 2 plasters a good outcome.



Online Safety Briefing



NEW PARENT FEATURES FOR FACEBOOK MESSENGER AND INSTAGRAM



As of 30th August new parental features for FB Messenger and Instagram globally.

Specific updates for Messenger:

- View how much time your child spends on the app.
- Updates on their contact list.
- Notification if your child reports someone.
- View who can message your child.
- View who can see your child's stories.

Specific updates for Instagram:

Before being able to message someone who doesn't follow them, people must now send a
text only invite to connect (in other words, no more unwanted explicit photos from people
you don't follow). No further interaction can take place unless the recipient accepts the
invite.

Discord Family Centre

Discord used to be popular with gamers, now it's hugely popular amongst non-gamers too. Historically Discord has been very lax regarding features that are available for parents to help keep their children safe, but this has recently changed, albeit the changes are a minuscule step in the right direction, at least it's something.

Essentially, like many other apps, Discord now has a Family Centre. Once set up parents can see:

- What servers (chat rooms) their children have joined or participated in.
- Everyone they've messaged.
- New users they've connected with.

Performing Arts Update


We Will Rock You School Edition:



Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit income dependant
