Message From the Principal

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
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Dear Parent / Carer

It was my turn to lead assemblies which focused on the theme of resilience and encouraged students to reflect on what resilience means to them. I shared stories of Sir



Year 11 students spent the week undertaking final revision lessons ahead of their mock examinations next week which will be an important opportunity to see where they are in relation to their individual target grades. I would also like to mention that the government released a message stating that these mock examinations would be used to award final grades in the event of any incident that meant students were unable to sit their examinations in the Summer. With this in mind, it is imperative that all Year 11 students treat these examinations as they would treat the terminal exams in the Summer.

On Wednesday night we held our TENC open evening where we were delighted to welcome many of our Year 11 students and parents to share everything we can offer at Key Stage 5. 

Lost Property


Please remind your child to check in reception if they have lost anything. We have a selection of items that need to be claimed.

Here is some more information about how to apply and become a volunteer with Northamptonshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust. If you have any questions, please contact the volunteer team at: Email: Volunteering@nhft.nhs.uk



Please note, we ask all volunteers to commit to regular volunteering of at least three hours a week, due to the amount of training and setup required. If possible, we ask volunteers to commit to at least six months of volunteering with us. We do not take volunteers for short-term placements unless there is a specific short-term role.

1. You fill out a volunteer application form

This can be found on our website https://www.nhft.nhs.uk/volunteer or directly at https://www.nhft.nhs.uk/wolunteer or directly at https://www.nhft.nhs.uk/wolun

2. You give us the contact details of people we can contact for a reference

3. You meet us for an informal chat

We will try and identify a suitable role in this meeting. However, we may have some options which we will talk through and then we will send you information on the possible volunteer roles for you to decide what you want to do. We will then try to set this up for you.

4. You fill out a health questionnaire

5. You complete a Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check

6. You do any training needed for the volunteer role

As part of the recruitment process to become a volunteer with us, you need to complete some mandatory training. This is the Health Education England Volunteering Learning Programme which is national training for NHS volunteers. 7. You sign a volunteer agreement that explains what NHFT expects of you and what you can expect from us.

Volunteer drivers

Volunteer drivers must have fully comprehensive car insurance and notify their insurer they are using the vehicle for Volunteering purposes (this is usually free). Volunteer drivers claim expenses for mileage.







Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit income dependant
