
Year 7 - Pop Up Art Workshop

Student Personal Presentation Policy

We have seen a visible increase in the number of students who are arriving to school with a nose piercing and a further small minority with tongue piercings. Both piercings are against school policy as outlined clearly in the Student Personal Presentation Policy. The full policy can be found on our website. The section on piercings is set out below:

Piercings

The standards and expectations on piercings for ALL students in Years 7-11 are as follows:

- *Students can wear a maximum of 2 stud earrings in each ear. No hoops or bars allowed.*
- *All other piercings are not allowed in school. These must be removed prior to arrival in school.*
- *Students who choose to have facial and/or other parts of the body pierced must have these completed at the start of the 6 week summer holiday in order for any piercing other than in the ear to be removed prior to returning to the school in September.*
- *All students who state that piercings other than ear piercings cannot be removed will be required to complete all their lessons and break-**times in the Academy's Isolation room until such time that the piercing can be removed.***

Following half term students who continue to not conform to this policy once spoken to will be sanctioned in line with the school's Behaviour and Exclusion Policy.

Similarly, can we remind parents that students should not be arriving to school in black jeans or trousers of jeans like material and style. Furthermore, our footwear policy does state that students should wear 'Footwear that meets the agreed standard which is leather or leather-like that can be polished. No canvas footwear or fabric trainers to be worn.' Additional guidance can be found under the 'Uniform' section of the school website.






Lunch-time Activities in the Library

SPEAK OUT. YOU'RE NOT ALONE!

Service Six TARGET project engaged 1001 young people, 525 of whom were disadvantaged. All resided in Northamptonshire or Leicestershire and were aged between 1 and 21 years of age, with most between 9 and 17 years. 799 young people responded to semi-structured questionnaires and they told us:

- 27% are regularly contacted online by strangers
- 30% have received pornography involving them
- 26% have had pornography
- 19% have been asked to meet strangers
- 6% have met strangers
- 32% reported to an adult

Furthermore disadvantaged young people are:

- 6% more likely to receive sexually explicit images or videos
- 6% more likely to send out sexually explicit images or videos
- 27% more likely to send out sexually explicit material willingly
- 27% less likely to report unwanted stranger contact and/or receipt of sexually explicit material to an adult
