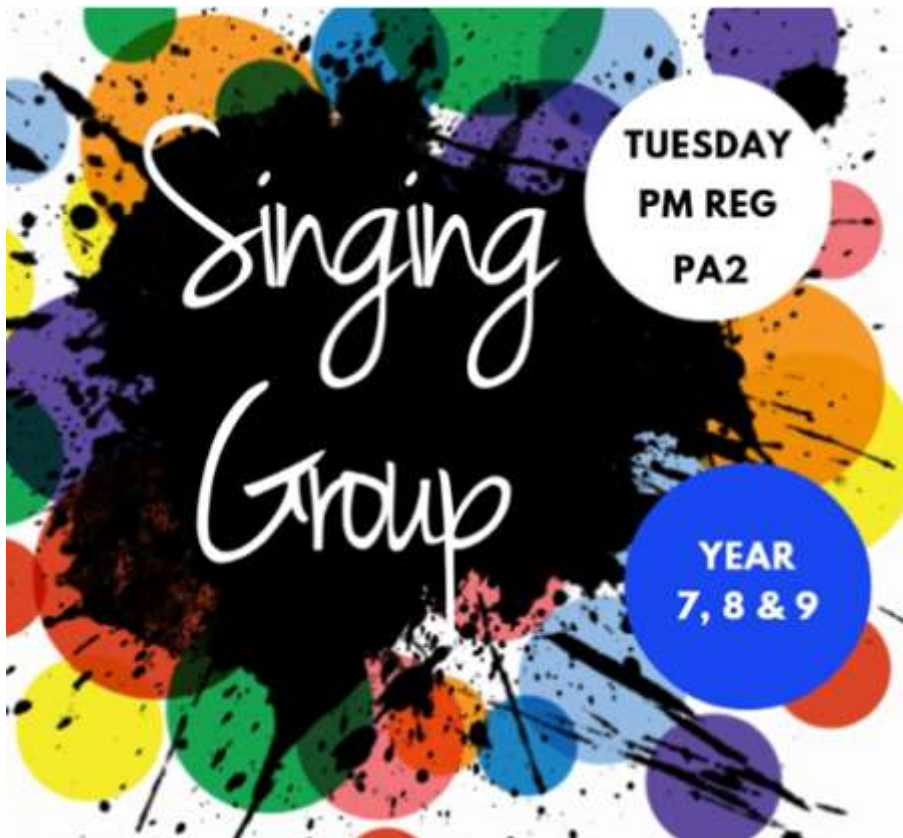

Biology Paper 1

What's assessed
Biology topics 1-4: Cell Biology; Organisation; Infection and response; and Bioenergetics.

20 minute chunks in these topics

1. Cell structure and specialised cells and magnification questions (1 required prac)
2. Particle movement (1 required prac)
3. Digestive system and enzymes (2 required pracs)
4. Heart and lung structure, circulatory system
5. Non communicable diseases
6. Communicable diseases and drug testing
7. White blood cells and vaccinations
8. Photosynthesis
9. Respiration




Chemistry Paper 1

What's assessed
Chemistry topics 8-12: Atomic structure and the periodic table; Bonding; structure, and the properties of matter; Quantitative chemistry; Chemical changes; and Energy changes.

20 minute chunks in these topics

2. Periodic table- trends and properties
3. Covalent bonding- giant and simple molecules
4. Ionic bonding and electrolysis (required prac)
5. Metals, nano particles and polymers

8. Reactivity series and extraction of metals
9. Neutralisation (required prac)
10. Exothermic and endothermic reactions (required prac)



Physics Paper 1

What's assessed

Physics topics 16–21: Energy; Electricity; Particle model of matter; and Atomic structure.

2. Specific heat capacity (required prac)
3. Power and efficiency
4. Methods of generating electricity
5. Electricity, symbols, circuits and changes in V,I,R
6. Resistance in different components (required prac)

8. Density and state changes (required prac)
9. Specific latent heat and pressure in gasses
10. Isotopes and history of the atom
11. Radioactive decay and radiation

Library News

Reading Matters

I led briefings for Year 7 and 8 this week on how important reading is to our students, not just because of the effect it will have on their academic studies but also on how reading about new or different experiences can make them a more well-rounded individual.



We ask that our Year 7 and 8 students read their books for at least 20 minutes everyday, to ensure that they are getting the most from their reading and so that when they quiz on that book, we are able to monitor their progress. Any help you can give your child by encouraging their reading at home or listening to them read aloud would be a fantastic help.

Accelerated Reader

Many of our students are taking their reading journey seriously and we are seeing some good quiz results from them. Encouraging the 20 minutes of reading everyday has really helped some students and this is being reflected in the word counts. As of Friday 8th March this stands at:

Year 7: 17,887,037

Year 8: 14,621,500

World Book Day

Thursday 7th March was World Book Day and we marked the occasion in school by placing 'Reading Is Power' posters in all form rooms. Years 7, 8 and 9 were encouraged to take part in a short story writing competition as a form. Each year group had a different story opener and then it was over to the forms to carry on the story. Each student within the form should have had the chance to write at least one line, so it is a real team effort. The entries will need to be returned by the end of Monday, when I will collect them in, read them and choose a winning form from each year group. The winning forms will have the opportunity to board the Purple Bus from Browns Books For Students when it visits the school in May. They will be able to choose books for the school library, a very important task.



We also held a game of Book Bingo in the Library over lunch-time, which proved to be great fun. After a line and four corners were called we then ran out of time for anyone to claim a house, so plan to continue on Friday lunch-time. The winners of both this and the short story competition will be announced next week.

SPEAK OUT. YOU'RE NOT ALONE!

Service Six TARGET project engaged 1001 young people, 525 of whom were disadvantaged. All resided in Northamptonshire or Leicestershire and were aged between 1 and 21 years of age, with most between 9 and 17 years. 799 young people responded to semi-structured questionnaires and they told us:

- 27% are regularly contacted online by strangers
- 30% have received pornography involving them
- 26% have had pornography
- 19% have been asked to meet strangers
- 6% have met strangers
- 22% reported to an adult

Furthermore disadvantaged young people are:

- 6% more likely to receive sexually explicit images or videos
- 6% more likely to send out sexually explicit images or videos
- 27% more likely to send out sexually explicit material willingly
- 22% less likely to report unwanted stranger contact and/or receipt of sexually explicit material to an adult
