Message From the Principal

Good afternoon

This week the government announced a 4-week pause at Step 3. It is expected that England will move to Step 4 on 19 July 2021, although the data will be reviewed after 2 weeks in case the risks have reduced. The government will continue to monitor the data and the move to Step 4 will be confirmed one week in advance.

Unfortunately, we have had to cancel the transition days for Year 6 children and replace these with virtual events. Hopefully we will continue with their summer school and ensure they receive a good induction ready for September. They will start with us on Friday 3rd September, whereas the rest of Team Rushden return on Monday 6th September.

So that we can continue to deliver face-to-face, high quality provision to all students, please continue to ensure that your children use the lateral flow tests to test twice weekly and report the results. We are still planning for Sports day to go ahead this summer with students remaining in their year group bubbles. Unfortunately we will be unable to accommodate visitors this year and a risk assessment will be published on our website.


A Level Photography

Section Taken From Rushden Academy Behaviour & Exclusion Policy

Unacceptable Behaviours

To ensure an orderly and safe environment for all who work at the Academy there are some rules to which all must adhere and, if broken, will be treated as very serious matters and would likely lead to a fixed term or possible permanent exclusion .

This includes the following:

- Behaviour which places the pupil or others in danger. To include physical violence towards others or being a direct cause of harm through reckless choice
- Setting off the fire alarm other than in an emergency. Any form of vandalism or intent to damage school property
- Any form of physical, or verbal abuse in particular racist and homophobic comments and actions intending to cause harm. This can also include gathering in a large group intending to intimidate others
- Bullying type behaviours directed at others and in particular where actions by a pupil or group of pupils presents a pattern of repeated incidents of bullying type behaviours
- Bringing into school any harmful or illegal substances, including tobacco, matches and lighters, drug paraphernalia, psychoactive substances and vaping products
- Repeated smoking or vaping on the premises, or on the way to and from school
- Bringing onto the school premises any type of weapon, including any type of knife/penknife or items that could be used as a weapon and not their intended purpose and any type of gun, including toy guns and replicas. This also applies to travel to and from school
- Using foul and abusive language directed towards others, in referring to staff, or within the hearing of staff
- Promoting and spreading extremism and hate verbally, graphically or via social media towards an individual or other groups based on race, religion, gender or identity, sexuality and disability
- Refusal to follow a reasonable instruction and continued non-compliance. Persistently presenting behaviours that disrupt the quality of teaching, learning and day to day management of the Academy
- Making malicious claims that prove to be unfounded against another member of the academy community be that another pupil or member of staff

Students From Rushden Academy Join Five Academies To Release Charity Single Cover Of 'Together'

Students from Rushden Academy joined forces with five other Academy schools in the Midlands and Buckinghamshire to release a new charity single cover of '[Together](#)', to support NHS Charities Together and boost their mental health.



The students' collective rendition of 'Together', originally performed by Christian pop duo For King & Country, with Tori Kelly and Kirk Franklin, pays tribute to all those who have suffered bereavement, loss, and rising levels of anxiety during lockdown.

The charity single and music video involved five students from Rushden Academy and 25 others from Grace Academies in Coventry, Solihull and Darlaston, Lord Grey Academy, and Elizabeth Woodville School North and South, who combined their musical talents to spread a message of hope to others.

Launched at a time when public singing is prohibited and students' mental health and resilience have been put to the test, the Song Project was organised by Grace Foundation's Ethos Teams, funded by IM Group, that work within specific Tove Learning Trust (TLT) Academies.

The students who took part in the project from Rushden Academy were Alyssa (Year 8), Tara (Year 9), Jorja (Year 9), Penny (Year 10), and Niamh (Year 11), and one of the students said:

"It has been really fun to have something to focus on. It was a unique experience; it tested my confidence and I met new people."



All year 11 pupils	Virtual Work Experience opportunities	Apply to be part of work experience, including some very famous companies.
All year 11 pupils	Post 16 Skills	What are the writing and research skills that you will need to complete your post-16 work.
BTEC and A-Level pupils	Short 6th Form tasks	These are a series of short tasks to get you thinking about your future course. They are grouped together by similar subjects and you can complete them in short sessions and tick off the ones completed.
A-Level pupils	GCSEPod Tasks	These are a series of subject specific tasks.
BTEC and A-Level pupils	Subject Progression Sheets	These tasks are more subject specific and include questions to think about, possible reading lists and tasks to help you to make the transition.
Extra maths and English	Keeping it fresh	These are a series of tasks and worksheets for anyone who thinks that they may need to re-sit their GCSE in either of these subjects.

How to Access Go4Schools

Go4Schools is the online system that Rushden Academy uses to track student attendance, student progress and assign homework tasks.

Students and parents can access this at home to keep up to date, by checking timetables and homework deadlines. Student progress reports will be published through Go4Schools 3 times a year.

Please follow the instructions below to access Go4Schools.

Student access to Go4Schools

- ◆ Go to the Go4Schools student access page (on the top right of the Go4Schools home page)
- ◆ Type in your school email address in the first time user box (your computer login in followed by @rushden-academy.net)

If you haven't logged on to GO 4 Students before, type your email address and click the "please send me a password" button.

Parental access to Go4Schools

Check if You or Your Child has Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- ◆ a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- ◆ a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- ◆ a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- ◆ you're worried about your symptoms
- ◆ you're not sure what to do

Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit - income dependant
