Dear Parent / Carer

The NHS did vaccinate several pupils on Monday following parental consent and will be doing so again on 5th November. Please understand that this is an NHS directive and not instigated by the school. As numbers rise nationally please continue to ensure your children are taking tests and keeping you, themselves and the community safe.

Here is the latest information from the NHS:

Please be aware that the COVID-19 vaccinations (Session 2) for children aged 12 to 15 years of age will be commencing on 05.11.21.

If your child **DOES NOT** meet age requirements, your child **HAS** received the vaccine (Session 1 or externally) or you **DO NOT PERMIT** your child for the vaccine to be administered - Please ignore this information.

If you have permitted for your child to receive the vaccine via the e-consent form, please be aware of the following ready for 05.11.21:

- Please remind your child to eat breakfast before they arrive at the Academy
- Please remind your child that a facial covering will need to be worn when receiving the vaccine.
- Please remind your child that for **05.11.21 only**, they are able to wear their Rushden Academy PE Top to ensure their identified arm is easily accessible.

Please be advised that e-consent form is **only accessible for 72 hours from 14.10.21 (10am)** per the School Aged Immunisation Service guidance.

If you require any further information or support, or would like to discuss consent, please do not hesitate to contact the School Aged Immunisation Service on 0800 170 7055 Option 5.

If Covid cases increase significantly at school we may need to revert to wearing masks once more, but at present this is not the case.

Please enjoy reading this week's bulletin. Year 11 needs to pay particular attention to details of the up and coming mocks. They need to work with their teachers and prepare well for their mock exams in November by making the most of the half term break and making revision notes.



MFL Update

This week we are pleased to share with you an article from our MFL Language Leader Charlie:

During the summer, I attended a classic car show with my family and we took our Rover P6. During the event, I noticed a peculiar looking car in amongst the others. When I approached it, I saw it was an old German car. After further inspection, I saw it was from East Germany (German Democratic Republic) and it was a police car! This was used before the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 in the communist half of Germany. It was driven by the Volkspolizei and doesn't look bad! You can clearly see the Communist Germany Symbol on it with sickle and hammer and a red, yellow and black design. It is a Trabant Wartburg and was relatively popular throughout the Eastern Bloc despite not being of very good quality due to slow economic development in the Soviet Union. This is the flag of the GDR:



Parents Guide to Covid19 Testing



Parent's Guide To Testing their Child/Children



Lateral Flow Device (LFD) Test:

- LFD testing should only be completed when anyone over the age of 11 is asymptomatic.
- Children over the age of 11 should complete twice weekly LFD testing.
- If your child has a positive lateral flow test, **take a PCR test and isolate until results arrive.**
- Children under the age of 11 years **should NOT be taking LFD tests.**

Additional Details to provide to your child's School:

- Dates of test.
- Type of Test (LFD, PCR).
- When symptoms began.
- Any close contacts. (friends, teacher, parent and siblings).

Drama

Miss Grainger would like to say thank you to the Year 8 and Year 10 Drama students who participated in open evening last week. The students prepared sections from Blood Brothers and Sparkleshark. They were all able to perform a well rehearsed extract from the plays.

Year 7 Drama students have been exploring a series of different Roald Dahl books by the use of performance skills. Students have looked closely at facial expressions, body language, gestures and use of voice. This week and next during drama lessons, students will look closely at Matilda and how they can portray different characters using performance skills. We are extremely looking forward to watching all of Year 7's assessment pieces.

Dance

Miss Pilgrim would like to thank all dancers who participated in the school's open evening last week. The students continually worked hard in lessons to ensure they were able to demonstrate a well polished performance.

Our year 9 students have been learning the Janet Jackson's Rhythm Nation routine. The style of 'Urban Jazz' includes using a technique of isolating one body part at a time to a very fast rhythmic pattern. All students must perform this in unison in order to replicate the famous music video.

Music

Gamelan music has its origins in Indonesia and Year 8s have been working on creating their own versions of this style of music within music lessons. We have been using Glockenspiels to replicate the sounds of the instruments found within the style and students have been working in groups to compose a piece of music with the focus being on the structure and layering of ideas to create a well rounded piece.



Check if You or Your Child has Coronavirus Symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), get a test as soon as possible. Stay at home until you get the result.

Main symptoms

The main symptoms of coronavirus are:

- ◆ a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature)
- ◆ a new, continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual)
- ◆ a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least 1 of these symptoms.

What to do if you have symptoms

If you have any of the main symptoms of coronavirus:

1. Get a test to check if you have coronavirus as soon as possible.
2. Stay at home and do not have visitors until you get your test result – only leave your home to have a test.

Anyone you live with, and anyone in your support bubble, must also stay at home until you get your result.

Use the NHS 111 online coronavirus service if:

- ◆ you're worried about your symptoms
- ◆ you're not sure what to do

Are You Eligible for Free School Meals?

If you are in receipt of any of the following, your child may be eligible for free school meals.

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit, with no element of Working Tax Credit, and a household income below £16,190 (as assessed by HM Revenue and Customs)
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Universal Credit - income dependant
